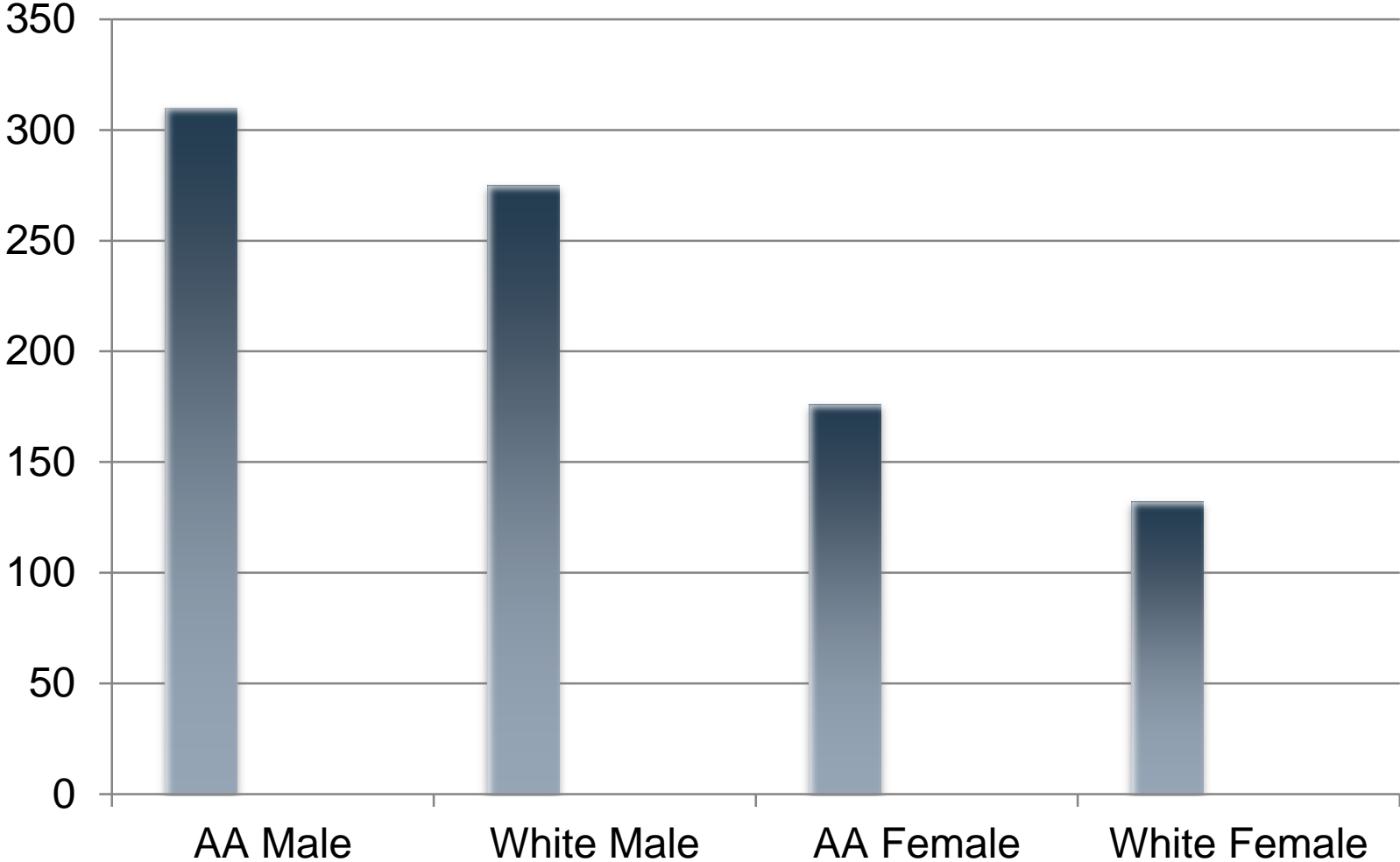

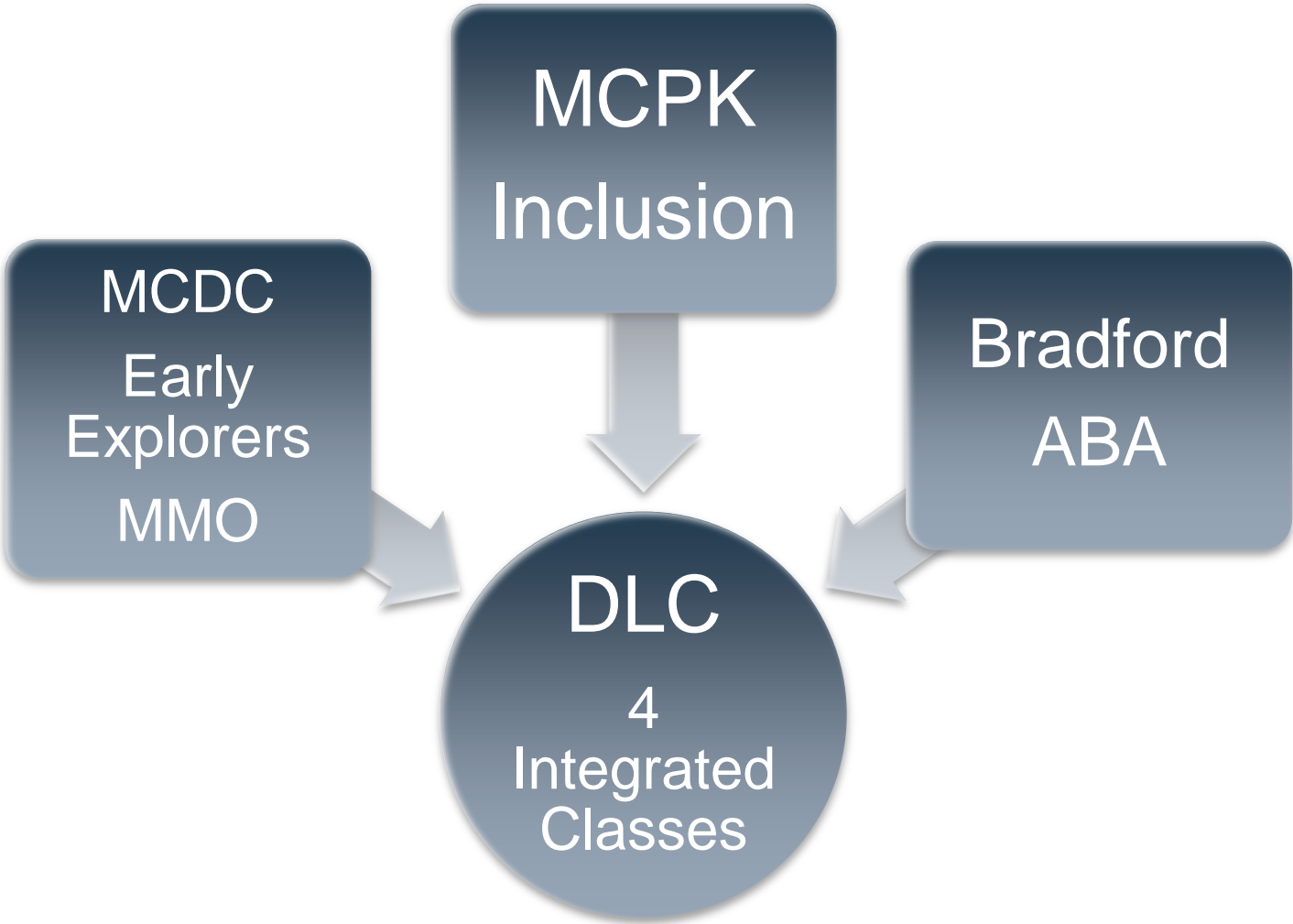
SE Classification Data- AA versus White Students

- o Highlights important academic skills such as: days of the week, counting, letter recognition, and other important pre-academic skills
- o New this year: each class also uses the Foundations curriculum (preschool kit)
 - o Systematic and developmentally appropriate reading/writing instruction
 - o Aligns with district K curriculum



Center Time

- o All children are encouraged to learn through play
 - o Centers like blocks, dramatic play, puzzles, and books encourage important social skills

MAP Mission Statement

The Montclair Achievement Program is committed to providing students with disabilities the necessary supports to grow academically, socially, emotionally and behaviorally, through a structured, supportive and enriching learning environment.



Program Goals

- ◆ Encourage High Academic Achievement
- ◆ Create a Safe, Responsive and Proactive Learning Environment
- ◆ Support Parents and Families in Making a Lasting Change
- ◆ Empower Students to Have a Voice and Impact on Their School Community

Behavioral Interventions



- ◆ Each room has a developmentally appropriate embedded behavior management program
- ◆ Students earn daily and weekly privileges for the absence of challenging behavior
- ◆ Behaviorist monitors the creation of individualized plans, consults with teachers individual & classroom behavior plans, and can assist to de-escalate situations

Social and Emotional Interventions

- ◆ Students receive individual and group counseling in order to share concerns, explore challenging topics, practice new skills and establish therapeutic rapport with the counselor.
- ◆ Counselor available to check-in with students and to provide crisis counseling and de-escalation support as needed.
- ◆ Counselor maintains ongoing home-school communication and collaboration.

Inclusion



MAP believes in educating students in the least restrictive environment and is dedicated to the thoughtful and systematic inclusion of students in the general ed classroom as soon as they demonstrate the necessary skills to succeed.

- ◆ Since the inception of the program, approximately 25% of students have fully transitioned to general ed classrooms.
- ◆ Approximately 40% of students currently in the K-8 programs are in the beginning stages of inclusion.

What does “Transition Services” mean? According to IDEA..

“Transition Services are a coordinated set of activities for a student with disabilities that are designed within an outcome oriented process and promote movement from school to post school activities.” Section 602 (30)(A)

The intent is that transition services become a **“plan for adulthood”** which focuses on preparing students to live, work and participate in their community.

Goals and activities should be designed for the following components:

Employment, Instruction, Community Experiences, Daily Living Skills, and Related Services

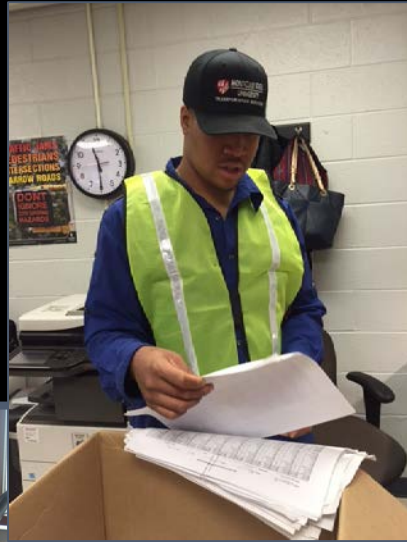
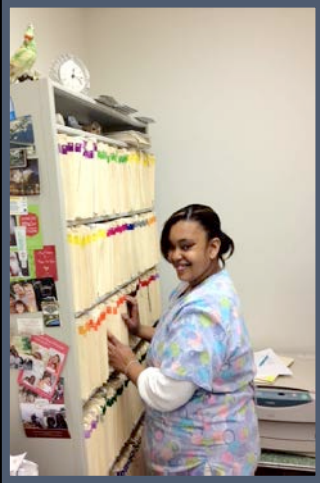

Transition to Adult Life

What are they doing now?

Since 2008, roughly **25** students have exited the Montclair Public School System having participated in the Community Based Transition Program.

Out of the 25 – 5 have moved and no longer live in the Montclair area

- ◆ 16/20 continue to be gainfully employed in the Montclair community
- ◆ 19/20 continue to access their community on a daily basis— going to the YMCA, accessing local businesses and restaurants, volunteering with local organizations, etc.
- ◆ 5/20 continue to pursue ongoing education and are enrolled in college classes
- ◆ 20/20 continue to travel independently
- ◆ 3/20 are living independently

Note: 8/ 25 students were brought back from out of district placements to receive instruction in transition in their own community...MONTCLAIR!!!

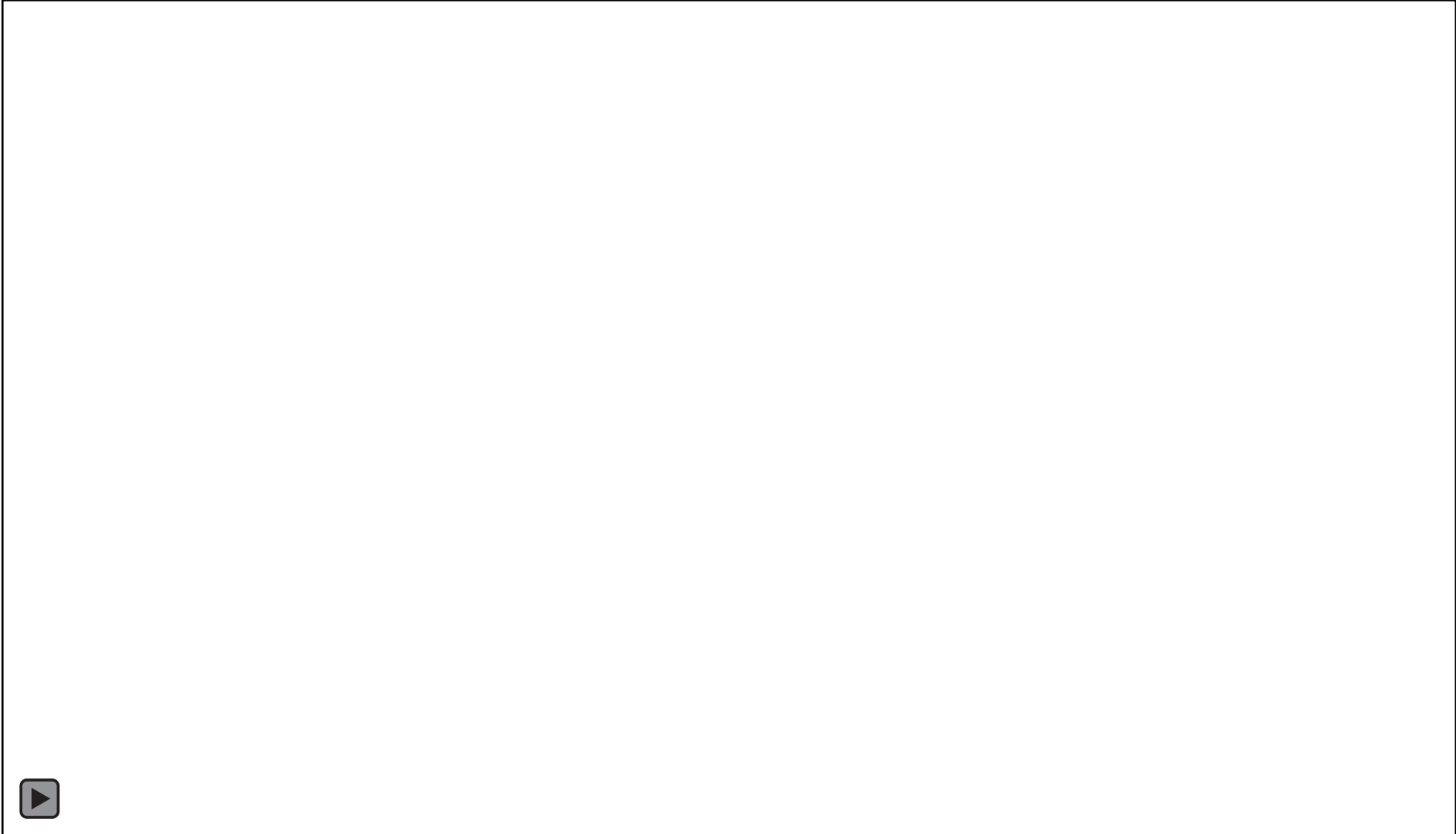

In-District Programs enable us to return students back from Out of District schools
